Residence one of Most Beautiful in Monroe

M. C. Migel, retired silk manufacturer who resides at Monroe, has taken title to the Charles G. McKendrick residence overlooking the village of Monroe, for the purpose of a Home for the blind women and girls. For the present the Home will simply be operated as a summer proposition and relays of guests will come there for two weeks each during the summer.

The McKendrick home is one of the show places of Monroe and is admirably fitted for the purpose for which it will be used.

The Corporation is known as REST HAVEN, Inc., and the incorporators are Mr. and Mrs. Migel, Mrs. Schuyler Schieffelin, Mrs. Elwood C. Smith, Mrs. Clarence S. Knight, Mrs. Frederick Hulse, Mrs. Frederick Newbury of Monroe; Mrs. Marion Meding, Henry B. Herts and Miss Amella T. Landor, of New York City.

Mr. Migel is Chairman of the New York State Commission for the Blind and has taken great interest in the welfare of blind persons. Last year he made a trip to England for the purpose of arranging for the exchange of standard literature for the blind and succeeded in arranging for a minimum postal rate in the books.
